I then began to combine aquatics with my other passion aviation. I became a Captain. At the same time, I started a career in sports administration that has now spanned four decades.

PLAN OF ACTION REVENUE

I know that many of them would be happy to get more involved in helping us to maximise the commercial value of what we do. Let's use this expertise for the benefit of all.


FINA'S PARTNERS

I will be open to discussions about working together with any commercial operators who have positive suggestions for the development of Aquatic sports and its athletes, as long as they are prepared to meet basic conditions: There must be total transparency, with all competitions taking place under FINA regulations approved by all FINA's stakeholders. WADA and FINA's anti-doping code must be adhered to at all times. There must be no discrimination between athletes, with a system that gives all athletes the opportunity to participate at the events. Finally, clubs and National Federations in every country must be protected.

I will also work with FINA's broadcasting and other media partners to find new ways of engaging audiences in venues and at home. We have a shared interest in promoting our sport as widely as possible, and we can achieve more with closer collaboration.

NATIONAL FEDERATIONS

I want National Federations to feel more valued. All our ambitions at an international level need to be actioned at a national level. One of my main priorities for FINA is building closer working relationships with National Federations, guiding them towards deeper and more beneficial relationships with their respective government, the NOC's and FINA sponsors. There must be no discrimination between National Federations. Each one is an important part of the FINA family and each one must feel that it is being treated equally.

ATHLETES

There is no sport without Athletes. They are the reason for FINA's existence. We need to teach and encourage the young people around the world who are in the early stages of their Aquatics journey. For some of these children the simple gift of a pair of goggles can be transformational. Others will need a coach or access to a diving board. FINA's renewed relationships with the National Federations will play a key role in delivering what is needed. We must support all athletes, giving each of them the maximum opportunity to achieve the best possible outcome from their sport career. FINA and WADA's Anti-Doping programme must be adhered to by all. Every athlete has the right to compete in a fair competition. The field of play must be equal for all athletes. We need to make sure that in every competition in every discipline the athletes are competing under unified technical rules.

I also want to do more to encourage athletes who are reaching the end of their competitive careers to stay in the sport. They are our greatest assets. Some are high profile global role models, and equally important are others who have never become a champion, but have gained many years of experience and knowledge during their Aquatics journey. We need them all. Every athlete who leaves their sport when they retire from competition is taking with them a lifetime of learning. These athletes should be the seeds that provide new growth. Some can be full-time coaches and administrators, but others can make so much difference just by dedicating the occasional day to inspiring the younger generation.
